


TRAINING WORKSHOP FOR SCHOOL TEACHERS



A preconference workshop on "Oral Medicine Specialists as tobacco Cessation Counsellors" was conducted on 22/08/2019 as part of the National IAOMR Postgraduate Convention by the department of Oral Medicine and Radiology at the Faculty of Dental Sciences, Bengaluru.

The inaugural function was graced by our Associate Dean (Post Graduate studies) Dr Latha Anandakrishna, Dr Kavitha Prasad, Associate Dean (Under Graduate Studies), Dr Prakash Chandra Shetty (Hospital Director) and Dr Rakesh N(Associate Professor, dept of OMDR). Dr Narasimha GVL, faculty at the department of Addiction Medicine, NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF MENTAL HEALTH & NEURO SCIENCE was the chief resource person.
